## Introduction

Louisiana Tech offers a teacher tuition scholarship that can be applied to these courses that will help teachers and professionals earn their +30 or certification on their teaching certificate. To be eligible, you must have a valid teaching certificate. The graduate credit earned will not be applied towards a degree program.

## How much will it cost?

If you are not already enrolled in Graduate School at Louisiana Tech, you will need to send a \$40 check along with your application to cover the application fee. After the teacher tuition scholarship is applied, your remaining tuition balance will be about \$140. Tuition can be paid through your BOSS account or the Comptroller's Office. Please note that students may take more than one course and receive the scholarship for both courses.
